

# Child Resistant Closures

Child Resistant Caps use mechanisms that create difficulty for children to open a container. Some of these styles include snap-safe caps, squeeze tab caps, squeeze and turn caps, and push and turn caps. Often, you will see either written or pictorial instructions on top of the cap. Similar to other caps, child resistant caps can have a variety of liners such as foam, foil, pulp, heat seal, PV and pressure sensitive. Some of these caps can also contain a tamper evident feature.

## Pictorial or Written Instructions



are often seen on top of the cap. These simple images make it clear to communicate how to open the product.

## Squeeze & Turn



These have grooves around the lid with two smooth panels on opposite sides. This is where you grasp the cap and squeeze while turning to open.

## Push & Turn



These caps open by applying downward pressure to the top of the cap and turning counter-clockwise at the same time.

## Squeeze Tab



For these caps, you gently apply pressure to the tab, squeezing inward while twisting open.

## Snap-Safe



An arrow is located on one side of the cap pointing down. This matches with a container that has an arrow pointing upward. When these arrows align, the cap can be removed.
